Positive and sustained destinations

- School leaver destination figures are published annually.
 This is a measure of how well we are doing supporting our pupils into the correct destination e.g. university / college / work / training.
- The most up to date information available is for session 2020/21, where 96.5% of our leavers went on to a positive and sustained post-school destination.
- This is above the Scottish figure, and is third highest in Renfrewshire.





Curriculum Consultation

We know that:

- Most young people achieve Level 3 by the end of S2
- Moving from 9 subjects in S3 and 7 subjects in S4 to 7 subjects for S3 & S4 allows
 - More time
 - More depth
- Making option choices earlier will positively impact on attainment.

We have consulted with staff, parent council and parents and there are ongoing focus groups with pupils at all stages.



S2/S3 Options Process

S2

- Pupils will select 5 different subjects to study in addition to English & Maths.
- These are the 7 subjects they will study for S3 **and** S4, leading to National Qualifications at the end of S4.
- Pupils will also continue to study core PE, PSE, Modern Languages & RE.

S3

- Pupils will drop 2 of their existing subjects, moving from 9 to 7.
- These are the 7 subjects they will study for S4, leading to National Qualifications at the end of S4.
- Pupils will also continue to study core PE, PSE & RE.

S4/S5 Options Process

S4

- Pupils will select 5 different subjects to study in S5.
- These are the 5 subjects they will study for S5.
- Pupils will also continue to study core PE and core PSE.

S5

- Pupils will study a minimum of 4 subjects in S6 (excluding those studying 3 at SCQF level 7).
- We encourage Volunteering and Work Experience in any private study periods.
- Pupils will also continue to study core PSE.

Consortia

All Schools across Renfrewshire offer consortia courses mainly in S6 for Advanced Highers, but also to a lesser extent in S5 for Higher courses. This allows pupils who are unable to choose a subject at Johnstone High due to timetabling restrictions to take the subject at another school.

Due to the impact of travelling time, we recommend, where possible, that S5 pupils try and choose their subjects from what we are able to offer so that their other subjects are not affected. S6s have private study periods, as they study a minimum of 4 subjects, which reduces the impact of travel time.

All pupils study one period of "core" PE and two periods of "core" PSE

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
- 1. If you select College with the intention of doing a course such as Construction, Criminology or Photography, for example, you cannot also pick that course to study here.
- 2. Criminology entry requirements: As this is a heavily oversubscribed course both in school and at college, it carries certain entry requirements. You must have a pass at National 5 (C or above) in English and a Social Subject (Geography, History, Modern Studies, RMPS).
- 3. Available at levels 4, 5 & 6 in Spanish/French/German. The language being delivered will be dependent on the prior experience of those choosing the course and on staffing.
- 4. This will either be Modern Studies or History, depending on staffing.

This table gives you an idea of how the courses are accredited for UCAS application. So an A at Higher is worth 33 UCAS points. SCQF credit points are explained in more detail later in the presentation.

It is worth noting that UCAS points for a pass NPA level 6 is the equivalent to a Higher C for courses of equivalent SCQF credit points.



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What happens next?
